What's been happening this week in Key Stage 3

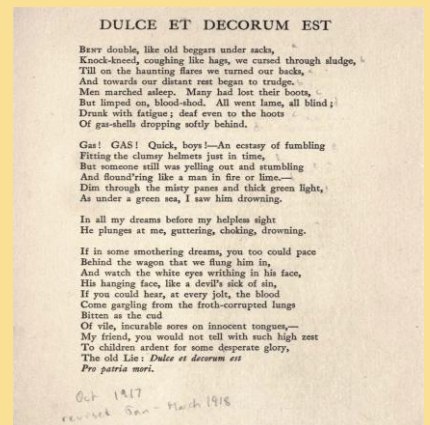


Davison

The class have been enjoying some of the new topics we are doing!

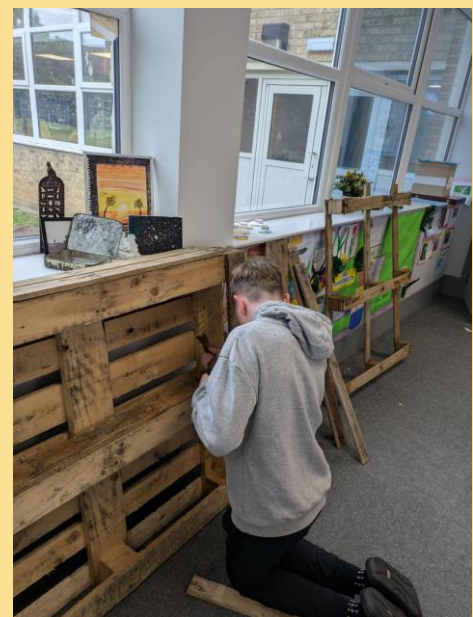
